

**DOCUMENT EXCERPTS CITING CREATION OF THE
EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION**

CALIFORNIA CODES GOVERNMENT CODE §29535, amended by Chapter 10, Statutes of 1996, AB 1869

“Within each county which is not within the jurisdiction of a statutorily created regional transportation planning agency or a council of governments, a local transportation commission shall be established and composed of three members appointed by the board of supervisors, three members appointed by the city selection committee of the county or by the city council in any county in which there is only one incorporated city, and, where applicable, three members appointed by a transit district and one member representing, collectively, the other transit operators in the county.

However, in a county in which there are no incorporated cities, five members may be appointed to the commission by the board of supervisors. The appointments to the commission may include members of the board of supervisors, the city councils, the transit district, and other local transit operators.

The appointing authority, for each regular member it appoints, may appoint an alternate member to serve in place of the regular member when the regular member is absent or disqualified from participating in a meeting of the commission.

A local transportation commission may employ staff, enter into contracts, and conduct other activities necessary to fulfill its responsibilities as a regional transportation planning agency and local transportation commission.”

CALIFORNIA CODES GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 67950-67951, pursuant to Senate Bill 902, February 23, 1995:

67950: The El Dorado County Transportation Planning Agency is hereby created, as a local area planning agency, and not as a part of the executive branch of the state government, to provide regional transportation planning for the area of El Dorado County, exclusive of the Tahoe Basin. The agency may be known by any other name it chooses.”

67951: “The agency shall be composed of three members appointed by the county board of supervisors and three members appointed by the city council of the City of Placerville. The appointing authority, for each regular member it appoints, may appoint an alternate member to serve in place of the regular member when the regular member is absent or disqualified from participating in a meeting of the agency.”

As current law specifically states the composition of EDCTC to include representatives of El Dorado County and the City of Placerville, special legislation may be required to change the applicable government code to enable a new city to join the EDCTC.

EDCTC JOINT EXERCISE OF POWERS AGREEMENT ESTABLISHING EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION – 1995: Section 5.1

“EDCTC shall be governed by a Board of Directors, hereinafter referred to as “Board”, comprised of six members, with three members appointed by the Board of Supervisors of El Dorado County and three members appointed by the City Council of the City of Placerville, to serve at the pleasure of each appointing governing body. Each member agency shall also appoint one or more alternate(s) to serve on the Board in the absence of that governing body’s regular board member. The City of South Lake Tahoe and the California Department of Transportation are designated ex-officio members and shall appoint a representative to the Commission.”

2004 AMENDED RULES AND BYLAWS OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

“The Commission shall be composed of eight members: three Supervisors appointed by the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors, three Council Members appointed by the City of Placerville City Council, one ex officio non-voting member from the City of South Lake Tahoe and one ex officio non-voting member from the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans, District 3) designated by the District Director.”
