SUBJECT: DRAFT BROADWAY VILLAGE CORRIDOR MULTI-MODAL IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

BACKGROUND

In September 2008, EDCTC received notification of the award of \$125,000 in grant funding from the California Department of Transportation's Community Based Transportation Planning Grant program to develop the Broadway Village Corridor Multi-Modal Implementation Plan (Plan). EDCTC staff distributed a Request for Proposals (RFP) on October 9, 2008. At the December 2008 EDCTC meeting, the Commission authorized staff to enter into a Professional Services Agreement with Lumos & Associates to develop the Broadway Village Corridor Multi-Modal Implementation Plan. EDCTC completed contract requirements with Caltrans for receipt of the grant funds and entered into a contract with Lumos & Associates on February 19, 2009.

DISCUSSION

The Broadway Village Corridor planning effort kicked off in February 2009 with a Technical Advisory Committee meeting. A Stakeholders' Advisory Committee (SAC) was established and ratified by the EDCTC Board in March 2009. The SAC role as community liaisons was to advise the consultants, City of Placerville, and EDCTC staff throughout the process. Four SAC meetings guided the planning process. A community meeting was held on September 9, 2009 at Louisiana Schnell School in the City of Placerville. The Plan lays out a long- and short-range vision for improved transportation and land use throughout the Broadway Village Corridor. The Plan includes proposals for improved non-motorized transportation facilities and improved landscape, streetscape, and transit facilities that encourage transit use and bicycle or pedestrian travel. The Plan also proposes safety, mobility, and operational improvements to improve vehicular circulation along the Broadway corridor through improved access management to the roadway and adjoining businesses.
