As the 2018 Chair was a representative from the County, a typical rotation would be to elect a Chair from the City representatives.

REQUESTED ACTION

None. This item is for information only.

BACKGROUND

The Transportation Development Act (TDA) §99238.5 requires EDCTC, as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency, to ensure the establishment and implementation of a citizen participation process including provisions for at least one public hearing in the jurisdiction represented by the Social Services Transportation Advisory Council (SSTAC). Since the El Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) currently claims all TDA funds for transit purposes, the formal unmet needs process and analysis referenced in the <u>TDA Statutes and California Code of Regulations</u> does not apply.

DISCUSSION

EDCTC conducted a citizen participation process public hearing for public transportation on December 6, 2018. EDCTC staff received two comments from the public during the hearing and two comments via e-mail. The four comments were forwarded to El Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) for their review. Below are the four comments and EDCTA's responses:

1) **Comment:** A robust and easily accessible transit service is critical to meeting the needs of the mobility-challenged community.

Response: El Dorado County Transit Authority commented that the Western El Dorado County Short and Long Range Transit Plan is currently being developed and will include analysis on transit needs in the service area. El Dorado Transit staff will use the plan as a guideline to strive to continue to meet the needs of the mobility-challenged community.

2) Comment: The homeless population in El Dorado County needs access to transit. Some members of the homeless population are ambulatory while others are not. However, for most it is difficult to interface with government services, including transit service. How to provide the homeless population with access to transit service needs to be considered.

Response: El Dorado County Transit Authority commented that the Western El Dorado County Short and Long Range Transit Plan is currently being developed and will include analysis on transit needs in the service area. El Dorado Transit staff will use the plan as a guideline to strive to continue to meet the needs of the homeless community.

3) **Comment:** The lack of weekend service makes it difficult to get to church on Sunday and go shopping on weekends, especially if you are disabled. There needs to be a way to take transit to Garden Valley on weekends.

Response: El Dorado County Transit Authority commented that the Western El Dorado County Short and Long Range Transit Plan is currently being developed and will include analysis on transit needs in the service area. El Dorado Transit staff will use the plan as a guideline to strive to continue to meet the needs of the community.

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4) Comment: El Dorado Hills south of Highway 50 is now and will be the home for about 3,000 seniors. These seniors live in gated communities and many cannot walk to a bus stop outside their community. These residents are poorly served by public transportation and many will not be driving their own vehicles in the future. The need for public transportation especially to travel to their physicians in Folsom.

Response: El Dorado County Transit Authority commented that the Western El Dorado County Short and Long Range Transit Plan is currently being developed and will include analysis on transit needs in the service area. El Dorado Transit staff will use the plan as a guideline to strive to continue to meet the needs of the community.

The comments and responses above have been forwarded to members of the EDCTC SSTAC for their consideration.

BACKGROUND

The California Association of Councils of Governments (CalCOG) is comprised of 44 member organizations that serve as a council of government, metropolitan planning organization, regional transportation planning agency, or county transportation commission or authority. CalCOG serves as a convener, bringing together its members, the League of California Cities, and the California State Association of Counties, to share information on successful regional programs. CalCOG also works to assist each member agency in developing capacity to serve its member's needs for regional coordination and policy development.

This delegate will represent the Commission at the Yosemite Leadership and Policy Conference March 14-17, 2019 along with the Executive Director.

The Executive Director participates on the CalCOG Directors Association of California (CDAC). CDAC meets on a regular basis (approximately every other month) to examine and discuss relevant regional, state, and federal issues, and serves as a staff resource and advisory body to the CalCOG Governing Council. EDCTC's annual CalCOG dues for 2018/19 are \$3,494.00, which is based on a population factor.

DISCUSSION

The organization supports and improves the effectiveness of the membership in addressing regional issues such as transportation, air quality, financial, housing, environmental, economic, and related topics. This is achieved through education and information sharing among the members and with others, such as regulatory, funding, and decision-making entities. The group will advocate for issues of common interest.

SUBJECT: FREEWAY SERVICE PATROL 2018 REPORT

REQUESTED ACTION

None. This item is for information only.

BACKGROUND

On May 5, 2016 the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) entered into a Professional Services Agreement with Extreme Towing of Placerville to continue a Freeway Service Patrol (FSP) on US 50 in El Dorado County. FSP began on December 13, 2010 and now operates from 6:30 AM to 9:00 AM and from 4:00 PM to 7:00 PM Monday through Friday. FSP is a congestion relief program which provides emergency tow and other services to the travelling public on US 50 from the El Dorado/Sacramento County line extending eastward to Greenstone Road. FSP is funded by the Capital Valley Regional Service Authority for Freeways and Expressways and the Caltrans FSP program. No local funds are required to provide FSP service in El Dorado County.

DISCUSSION

EDCTC works closely with the California Highway Patrol (CHP) to administer the FSP. CHP performs tow truck operator and vehicle inspections and monitors daily FSP operations. CHP provides inspection reports to and communicates with EDCTC regularly. EDCTC monitors the quality of FSP service through an online survey which each assisted motorist is directed to at the time of service. The survey offers the assisted motorist the opportunity to rate the quality of the service, make comments, and recommend improvements. To date, EDCTC has received many completed surveys, all of which highly praise the El Dorado County FSP. All survey responses rate the FSP as "excellent" and thank the EDCTC for providing the service. Some of the comments received include:

"Garren the (ANGEL) was extremely helpful and kind. This is a wonderful service and definitely appreciated and very much needed. Would be great to extend it further up HWY 50 one day!!!!!!"

"The tow Truck driver was very helpful!!

Very courteous, I didn't even know this service was available!"

"Keep it going! This is a great service and have been assisted multiple times. This time was a critical tow after a really bad accident. Just awesome!"

In addition to the online survey, EDCTC monitors the FSP by recording and monitoring specific details of the FSP duties performed. Each motorist assist is recorded via a mobile device application by the tow truck driver. The assist record includes information regarding the time and date, type of vehicle, location, type, and duration of assist performed. To date El Dorado County FSP service has been operating on par with many of the more urban FSP services. EDCTC collects and records this information monthly.

The Draft OWP was presented at the March 1, 2018 Commission Meeting and the Final was approved at the June 7, 2018 meeting. Amendment #1 increased the grant and match funding on Work Element (WE) 261 – El Dorado Hills Business Park Community Transportation Plan and was approved on September 6, 2018. Amendment #2 includes the following changes:

- At the direction of the Commission on December 6, 2018 expenditures were increased for the
 cost of the 2019 American Leadership Forum professional development course for the
 Executive Director. Director Deloria obtained a \$4,000 scholarship for the course and the
 remaining balance of \$6,000 was added to Amendment #2.
- The professional services contract was increased and staff time was decreased for the El Dorado Hills Business Park Community Transportation Plan, WE 261. The total project cost didn't change.
- Staff time and office expenses were adjusted between work elements based on actual charges fiscal year to date.

The total amount of the FY 2018/19 OWP and Budget Amendment #2 is \$2,116,063 which is a .6% increase from Amendment #1.

PROGRAMMING

REQUESTED ACTION

Adopt Resolution 18/19.13 (Attachment A) approving the following Urban Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (Urban STBGP) programming action:

• Program \$168,500 in Urban STBGP funds to the Silva Valley – Harvard Way Improvement Project – Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Improvements.

BACKGROUND

As the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) charged with programming federal and state transportation funding for the west slope of El Dorado County, EDCTC is responsible for the programming of Urban STBGP funds to projects or programs in our jurisdiction. Urban STBGP funds are reimbursable federal aid funds, subject to all the requirements of Title 23, United States Code. Eligible costs include program planning, preliminary engineering (including environmental studies), right-of-way acquisition, capital costs, and construction costs associated with an eligible activity. Urban STBGP funds can only be utilized in the portion of El Dorado County that is located within the Sacramento Urbanized area, consistent with US Census data. Attachment B are maps of the Sacramento Urbanized area of El Dorado County.

DISCUSSION

On January 28, 2019 the El Dorado County Community Development Services Department of Transportation requested Urban STBGP funding to be programmed by EDCTC to support the delivery of the Silva Valley – Harvard Way Improvement Project – ADA Improvements. The original scope and budget for the project only included circulation improvements at the intersection of Silva Valley Road and Harvard Way. The requested programming of \$168,500 in Urban STBGP programming will provide the necessary funding to add ADA improvements to the intersection improvements project.

Any unutilized Urban STBGP funds remaining at the completion of the proposed project will return to EDCTC for future programming.

The current unprogrammed balance available in Fiscal Year 2018/2019 of \$3,062,255 will be reduced to \$2,893,755 as a result of this programming action. The current estimated balance available out to Fiscal Year 2021/2022 of \$5,643,077 will be reduced to \$5,474,577 as a result of this programming action.

The EDCTC Urban STBGP Fund Spreadsheet in Attachment C shows the programming history and available future funds.

WHEREAS, this project submitted for consideration for programming has been determined to be Urban STBGP Eligible; and







BACKGROUND

In order to identify regional transportation project delivery issues and challenges, EDCTC staff performs Planning, Programming, and Monitoring (PPM) duties for regionally significant projects in the EDCTC region. These PPM duties are conducted in collaboration with the El Dorado County Department of Transportation, City of Placerville Engineering Division, El Dorado Transit Authority, the Sacramento Area Council of Governments, and the Caltrans Department of Local Assistance.

DISCUSSION

The report includes projects funded with State Transportation Improvement Program, State Highway Operations and Protection Program, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017 (Senate Bill 1) Programs, Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality, Surface Transportation Block Grant Program, Active Transportation Program, Local Transportation Fund, Bicycle/Pedestrian funds, as well as regionally significant projects funded with local funds, such as Traffic Impact Mitigation fees.

The report includes "project status symbols" to indicate whether a project:

is within current cost and schedule



has potential cost and/or schedule impacts



has known cost and/or schedule impacts



As a result of discussions between members of the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors, the public, Caltrans, and EDCTC staff about the need for the public to have ready access to information about Caltrans' State Highway Operations and Protection Program (SHOPP) projects in El Dorado County, the report contains a map and information detailing Caltrans' SHOPP projects in El Dorado County. The report also contains a spreadsheet that shows current grant-funded projects and studies.
