SUBJECT: TRANSPORTATION DEVELOPMENT ACT FISCAL YEAR 2019/2020 APPORTIONMENT AND ALLOCATION FOR LOCAL TRANSPORTATION FUNDS, STATE TRANSIT ASSISTANCE FUNDS, AND STATE OF GOOD REPAIR FUNDS

REQUESTED ACTION

Adopt Resolution 18/19.23 approving the Transportation Development Act Fiscal Year (FY) 2019/2020 Apportionment and Allocation for Local Transportation Funds, State Transit Assistance Funds, and State of Good Repair Funds.

BACKGROUND and DISCUSSION

The Transportation Development Act (TDA) provides three funding sources:

- 1. Local Transportation Fund (LTF) from a quarter cent of the general sales tax collected statewide.
- 2. State Transit Assistance fund (STA) from the statewide sales tax on diesel fuel.
- 3. State of Good Repair (SGR) from a portion of the Transportation Improvement Fee included in Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

The State Board of Equalization, based on sales tax collected in each county, returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's LTF. The State Controller's Office (SCO) allocates the STA tax and the SGR revenue, by formula, to planning agencies and other eligible agencies. Statute requires that 50% of STA and SGR funds be allocated according to population and 50% be allocated according to operator revenues from the prior fiscal year.

The El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) is the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) responsible for apportioning and administering these funds for this region. The attached Findings of Apportionment summarizes the estimates for FY 2019/2020.

The LTF allocation purposes, in order of priorities, as identified by law, are as follows:

- 1. Transportation Development Act fund administration (by EDCTC and the County Auditor);
- 2. Planning and programming undertaken by EDCTC (up to 3% of the fund);
- 3. Pedestrian and bicycle projects (optional, up to 2% of the funds remaining, after administration and planning);
- 4. Public transportation operations (including new transit services that have been identified by the Commission as "unmet transit needs" that are "reasonable to meet"); and,
- 5. Other transportation purposes (including additional transit and bicycle facilities, and streets and roads). The Commission may only apportion (and subsequently may only approve claims for) "other transportation purposes" when all other uses of the funds, to the limits described above, have been exhausted.

EDCTC allocates the LTF funds, as determined by population, for the western slope region of El Dorado County and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency allocates the LTF funds, as determined

by population, for the eastern slope of El Dorado County. For FY 2019/2020, the County Auditor estimates EDCTC's share of LTF revenues for apportionment to be \$5,296,363, plus \$500,000 in fund balance available to program.

Administration, Planning, Programming

The County Auditor has estimated \$10,000 for administration from the estimated FY 2019/2020 LTF revenue total. This amount is reimbursed to the County Auditor and is not included in EDCTC's Overall Work Program.

The EDCTC FY 2019/2020 Overall Work Program and Budget includes administration, planning, programming and the annual payment to SACOG for a total of \$436,944.71. EDCTC LTF funds are used throughout the work program to support planning and as a required local match for state and federal grant funds. Under the Commission's Memorandum of Understanding with Sacramento Area Council of Government (SACOG), EDCTC is obligated to allocate 2% of TDA funds for SACOG federal transportation planning and programming activities after administration and any non-motorized allocations. The SACOG allocation equals \$106,944.71 for FY 2019/2020.

Non-Motorized – Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities (Article 3)

State law offers EDCTC an option to apportion up to 2% of the LTF (after administration and planning) to the City and County for facilities provided for the exclusive use of pedestrians and bicycles. The Commission primarily uses these non-motorized funds to provide matching funds for federal and state grants, such as Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality and Active Transportation Program (ATP) grants. The 2019/2020 allocation totals \$109,127.26.

Public Transportation – Transit (Article 4)

The El Dorado County Transit Authority notified the Commission staff that their claim for FY 2019/2020 LTF funds will be \$5,240,291.03 for operating expenses. A 3% contingency of the Article 4 funds up to a maximum of \$500,000.00 is retained in the LTF fund's unreserved fund balance for transit's future needs. The transit contingency balance is currently at the maximum amount of \$500,000.00.

Other Transportation (Article 8)

No LTF funds remain available for Article 8 – Other Transportation purposes. If LTF funds were available for the fiscal year, the funds would be apportioned to the City of Placerville and the County of El Dorado by population for all purposes necessary and convenient to the development and operation of the public transportation system, including road rehabilitation, maintenance, and repair.

State Transit Assistance Funds (STA)

The estimated FY 2019/2020 STA funds available for the El Dorado County Transit Authority is \$1,742,830.00.

State of Good Repair (SGR)

The estimated FY 2019/2020 SGR funds available for the El Dorado County Transit Authority is \$242,799.00. Funds will be reimbursed to EDCTA after Commission approval of a claim for an approved SGR project.

WHEREAS, pursuant to California Government Code, Title 7.95, Section 67950, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) was created as a local planning agency to provide regional transportation planning for the area of El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 29532.1(g) identifies EDCTC as the designated Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and is responsible for the planning, allocating and/or programming of funds and administration of the Transportation Development Act of 1971 (TDA), as amended thereafter; and

WHEREAS, the County of El Dorado, the City of Placerville, and the El Dorado County Transit Authority are each required to file annual transportation claims for the funds, if any, from the Local Transportation Fund (LTF), the State Transit Assistance Fund (STA) and the State of Good Repair Fund (SGR) of the Western Slope of the County, as apportioned to them by the EDCTC, pursuant to the TDA; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the EDCTC, under the provisions of the TDA, to review the annual transportation claims and to make allocations of monies from the LTF, STA, and SGR funds based on the estimated revenue upon approving said claim; and

WHEREAS, the Auditor of said County is instructed to pay monies in the fund to the claimants pursuant to allocation instructions received from the El Dorado County Transportation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the County Auditor issued a report of estimated revenues for LTF for Fiscal Year (FY) 2019/2020 and the State Controller's Office issued a report of estimated revenues for STA and SGR Funds.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the EI Dorado County Transportation Commission shall review the claims as they are received, approve same for the FY 2019/2020 funds estimated to be available in the LTF, STA, and the SGR funds, and make the following allocations:

- 1. To the El Dorado County Auditor-Controller for administrative costs in the amount of \$10,000.00, per Section 99233.1.
- 2. To the El Dorado County Transportation Commission for TDA administration and for planning and programming in the amount of \$436,944.71, per Section 99233.1 and 99233.2.

- 3. To be reserved by the El Dorado County Auditor's Office for future reimbursements to the City and County for pedestrian and bicycle facilities as programmed and claimed in the amount of \$109,127.26, per Sections 99233.3 and 99234.
- 4. Retain contingency in the amount of \$500,000.00 in the Local Transportation Fund for future transit needs. The previous contingency balance was \$500,000.00 and the maximum amount is \$500,000.00.
- 5. To the El Dorado County Transit Authority for Article 4 purposes, the total amount available of \$5,240,291.03, per Sections 99233.8, 99260(a), and 99262.
- State Transit Assistance Funds To the El Dorado County Transit Authority for State Transit Assistance Funds in the estimated amount of \$1,742,830.00 plus interest, for capital improvements, per Section 99314.6. This allocation is to be paid out as FY 2019/20 revenues are received and available for payment by the County Auditor.
- State of Good Repair Funds To be reserved by the El Dorado County Auditor's Office for future reimbursements to the El Dorado County Transit Authority for State of Good Repair Funds in the estimated amount of \$242,799.00 plus interest. This allocation is to be paid out after a reimbursement claim for an eligible project is approved by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission has requested that approved claims be paid in full, provided the funds are available.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that allocation instructions shall be prepared for each claimant in accordance with the above, and pursuant to the El Dorado County Transportation Commission rules and regulations. The Executive Director, appointed by the Commission, is authorized to sign the allocation instructions and to issue the instructions to the County Auditor to pay the claimants in accordance with the above allocations and conditions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the claimants are to be notified by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission of action on their claims.

The El Dorado County Department of Transportation submitted a claim requesting reimbursement of \$26,870.19 for the matching portion of the completed project.

REQUESTED ACTION

Accept the Final Transportation Development Act Triennial Performance Audits of the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) and the El Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) for fiscal years 2015/2016, 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and direct the Executive Director to submit the audits to Caltrans.

BACKGROUND

The EDCTC is statutorily required by California Public Utilities Code §99246 to designate entities other than itself to conduct a Triennial Performance Audit of the activities of the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) and the Transit Operator to whom it allocates Transportation Development Act (TDA) funds. The performance audit generally follows the guidelines established in the <u>Performance Audit Guidebook for Transit Operators and Regional Transportation Planning Entities</u>, published by the California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) Division of Mass Transportation.

While meeting the legal requirements for conducting a performance audit is important, a performance audit also provides an opportunity for an independent, objective, and comprehensive review of the economy, efficiency, and effectiveness of the entity being audited. The audit provides additional benefits as well:

- Provides management with useful information to assess past activities and provides insight for future planning efforts
- Provides management with a review and evaluation of an agency's organization and operations
- Presents an opportunity to utilize auditor expertise which can supplement staff work
- Assures public accountability for the use of public funds

DISCUSSION

The El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) retained LSC Transportation Consultants, Inc. to prepare the Triennial Performance Audits of both EDCTC as the RTPA and El Dorado County Transit Authority (EDCTA) as the transit operator. The Draft Triennial Performance Audits of EDCTC and EDCTA covering this period of time were presented to the EDCTC Board on May 2, 2019.

EDCTC FINDINGS

- The EDCTC has complied with the requirements listed in the TDA and other statutes.
- The EDCTC has set forth and follows a clear and effective TDA allocation process.
- The filing and archiving of plans and other data is well organized.
- The majority of information requested for this audit was provided promptly and in electronic formats.
- As evidenced by the long list of completed and in progress transportation projects in western El Dorado County, EDCTC is an effective Regional Transportation Planning Entity.

• The EDCTC and the EDCTA have a good working relationship with defined duties which allow for a productive transit system.

EDCTC RECOMMENDATIONS

Recommendation 1: After the next decennial census, or other official adjustments to the Sacramento Urbanized boundary, EDCTC should review the blended farebox ratio requirement to ensure that the ratio accurately represents the proportion of urban and rural areas in western El Dorado County.

The blended farebox ratio requirement for El Dorado Transit adopted in June 2014 is based on the proportion of the western El Dorado County population which resides within urban and rural areas. The population of western El Dorado County has been growing at a modest pace since the 2010 Census. Therefore after the 2020 Census, the El Dorado Transit blended farebox ratio calculation should be adjusted to reflect new population figures. Additionally, it is likely that the Sacramento Urbanized Area boundary may expand further, as a result this will increase the portion of western El Dorado County living in an urban area. It should be noted that according to the farebox ratio methodology approved in 2014, the proportion of EDCTA service area located in the urban areas is not factored into the blended farebox ratio. Therefore, EDCTA service area changes resulting from the on-going Short Range Transit Plan effort will not spur an adjustment to the farebox ratio.

Recommendation 2: After Caltrans develops web accessibility guidelines per AB 434, incorporate these standards into the EDCTC website and review biannually.

AB 434 stipulates that before July 1, 2019, each state agency post on the homepage of their website a signed certification that the website meets Web Content Accessibility Guidelines 2.0 or the most recent version published by Web Accessibility Initiative of the World Wide Web Consortium. As a state agency, Caltrans will be subject to these rules. In the next year or so, Caltrans will likely provide requirements and guidance for RTPAs to also meet these internet accessibility standards.

Currently, EDCTC makes an effort to have on line documents accessible for all users. PDFs on the EDCTC website can be accessed as "readable" documents. As web accessibility guidelines are developed by Caltrans, EDCTC should incorporate these standards into the EDCTC website as well as review the guidance biannually to ensure that the newest standards are used.

Following EDCTC Board approval and direction, the Executive Director will submit the Final Transportation Development Act Triennial Performance Audits of the El Dorado County Transportation Commission and the El Dorado County Transit Authority for fiscal years 2015 through 2018 to Caltrans.

REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Executive Director to sign the Second Amendment to the Agreement between the El Dorado County Transportation Commission and El Dorado County for FY 2013/14 and FY 2014/15 RSTP Funds (Attachment A).

BACKGROUND

The Regional Surface Transportation Program was established by California State Statute utilizing Surface Transportation Program Funds that are identified in Section 133 of Title 23 of the United States Code. The State of California allows smaller counties to exchange their apportionment of federal RSTP funds for State Highway Account funds.

DISCUSSION

The El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) distributes the RSTP funds to the City of Placerville and El Dorado County as part of its responsibilities as the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) for the Western Slope of El Dorado County. EDCTC executes an agreement between EDCTC and the RSTP Exchange recipients to provide contract management and oversight of the program funds.

The Agreement Between EDCTC and El Dorado County for the FY 2013/14 and FY 2014/15 Regional Surface Transportation Funds (Agreement) included Exhibit A (Attachment B) programming the funds to projects. The Agreement allows for changes to the distribution of project funding with an amendment to Exhibit A. The First Amendment to the Agreement included Exhibit A-1 (06/28/16) (Attachment C) revising the distribution of funding on the projects.

The Second Amendment to the Agreement is to amend Exhibit A-1 (06/28/16) to revise the distribution of funding on the projects. Exhibit A-2 (05/21/19) decreases the FY 2013/14 funding on the US 50/Camino Area Safety project and increases funding on the Road Rehabilitation and Maintenance Project. The expiration date of these funds is 6/19/19. The amendment is needed to maximize the use of the funds prior to the expiration date.

The FY 2014/15 funding was revised on Exhibit A-2 (05/21/19) decreasing the US 50/Camino Area Safety Project by \$49,186.00 and adding the funding to the Intersection Safety/Sight Triangle Improvement Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual promises and covenants hereinafter contained, RSTP Exchange Recipient and EDCTC mutually agree to amend the terms of the Agreement in this Second Amendment to Agreement as follows:

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION AND EL DORADO COUNTY FOR FY 2013/14 AND FY 2014/15 REGIONAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM EXCHANGE FUNDS

This agreement is made on 11/17/15 by and between the El Dorado County Transportation Commission, hereinafter referred to as "EDCTC," and El Dorado County, hereinafter referred to as "RSTP Exchange Recipient."

WHEREAS, as authorized by section 182.6(g) of the Streets and Highways Code, EDCTC has entered into agreements X14-6157(050) and X15-6157(054) with the State of California, through the Department of Transportation (Caltrans), to assign a defined portion of its annual Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) apportionment to Caltrans in exchange for fiscal year (FY) 2013/14 and FY 2014/15 nonfederal State Highway Account funds; and

WHEREAS, EDCTC is authorized to use these exchanged funds (hereinafter RSTP Exchange Funds) to assist local agencies to promote projects which otherwise qualify for RSTP funds; and

WHEREAS, EDCTC is required to execute formal written agreements between EDCTC and RSTP Exchange Recipients and provide oversight of the program funds; and

WHEREAS, the EDCTC Board approved the allocation and payment of FY 2013/14 funds on June 19, 2014 calculated per the formula based distribution policy adopted by EDCTC on February 3, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the EDCTC received the FY 2014/15 RSTP Exchange funds on July 16, 2015 which will be paid to the County per the formula based distribution policy adopted by the EDCTC on February 3, 2011 after the execution of this agreement; and

WHEREAS, EDCTC is implementing this agreement and Exhibit A to perform contract management and oversight of the RSTP Exchange Funds; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained herein, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The RSTP Exchange Recipient agrees to use the funds only for the RSTP Exchange eligible project(s) described in Exhibit A.
- 2. The projects described in Exhibit A, and the amounts allocated therefore, may be amended from time to time without changing the rest of this Agreement, by means of approval by the EDCTC Board of a revised Exhibit A, which shall be designated by a date and number (e.g., "Exhibit A-1 (DATE)").
- 3. The RSTP Exchange Recipient agrees to mention EDCTC's role in funding the project in any press release or media event held by the RSTP Exchange Recipient to promote a RSTP funded project.
- 4. EDCTC agrees to allocate all of these Funds only for those projects implemented by cities,

counties, and other RSTP Eligible agencies as are authorized under Article XIX of the California State Constitution, in accordance with the requirements of Section 182.6(d)(1) of the Streets and Highways Code.

- 5. The RSTP Exchange Recipient agrees to submit a status report to EDCTC by April 30 each year with the details of the RSTP funding by project listed on Exhibit A.
- 6. EDCTC requires project sponsors receiving those funds provided under this agreement to establish a special account for the purpose of depositing therein all payments received from EDCTC pursuant to this agreement; for counties, within their County Road Fund.
- 7. The RSTP Exchange Recipient agrees to have an approved budget appropriation of the RSTP Exchange project(s) within three years. The end date of these funds will be five years from the date funds were allocated by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission. Failure to complete the RSTP Exchange project(s) within the five years shall allow EDCTC to request repayment from the RSTP Exchange Recipient and reprogram such Exchange Funds for other purposes.

8. COST PRINCIPLES

- A. EDCTC and RSTP Exchange Recipient agrees to comply with Office of Management and Budget Supercircular 2 CFR 200, Cost Principles for State and Local Government and the Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments.
- B. RSTP Exchange Recipients will be obligated to agree that (A) Contract Cost Principles and Procedures, 48 CFR, Federal Acquisition Regulations System, Chapter 1, Part 31, Et Seq., shall be used to determine the allowability of individual project cost items and (B) Those parties shall comply with Federal Administrative Procedures in accordance with 2 CFR 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements To State And Local Governments. Every subrecipient receiving funds as a contractor or sub-contractor under this agreement shall comply with Federal administrative procedures in accordance with 2 CFR 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments.
- C. Any Fund expenditures for costs which RSTP Exchange Recipient has received payment or credit that are determined by subsequent audit to be unallowable under Office of Management and Budget Supercircular 2 CFR 200 are subject to repayment to EDCTC and Caltrans. The implementation of the Supercircular will cancel 49 CFR Part 18.

9. THIRD PARTY CONTRACTING

A. RSTP Exchange Recipient shall not award a construction contract over \$10,000 or other contracts over \$25,000 on the basis of a noncompetitive negotiation for work to be performed using Funds without the prior written approval of Caltrans. This provision shall not apply to professional service contracts of the type which are required to be procured in accordance with Government Code Sections 4525 (d), (e), and (f).

- B. RSTP Exchange Recipient agree that any subcontract or agreement entered into by RSTP Exchange Recipient using Funds received pursuant to this Agreement shall contain all of the fiscal provisions of this Agreement; and shall mandate that travel and per diem reimbursements and third-party contract reimbursements to subcontractors will be allowable as project costs only after those costs are incurred and paid for by the subcontractors and only if consistent with Paragraph 12, below.
- C. In addition to the above, the pre-award requirements of third party contractor/ consultants with RSTP Exchange Recipient shall be consistent with Local Program Procedures as published by Caltrans.

10. ACCOUNTING SYSTEM

RSTP Exchange Recipient, its contractors and subcontractors, shall establish and maintain an accounting system and records that properly accumulate and segregate Fund expenditures by line item. The accounting system of RSTP Exchange Recipient, its contractors and all subcontractors shall conform to Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP), enable the determination of incurred costs at interim points of completion, and provide support for project payments.

11. RIGHT TO AUDIT

For the purpose of determining compliance with this Agreement and other matters connected with the performance of RSTP Exchange Recipient's contracts with third parties, EDCTC, RSTP Exchange Recipient, RSTP Exchange Recipient 's contractors and subcontractors and Caltrans shall each maintain and make available for inspection all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other evidence pertaining to the performance of such contracts, including, but not limited to, the costs of administering those various contracts. All of the above referenced parties shall make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times for three years from the date of payment of Funds to RSTP Exchange Recipient. Caltrans, the California State Auditor, or any duly authorized representative of Caltrans or the United States Department of Transportation, shall each have access to any books, records, and documents that are pertinent for audits, examinations, excerpts, and transactions, and RSTP Exchange Recipient shall furnish copies thereof if requested.

12. TRAVEL AND SUBSISTENCE

Payments to RSTP Exchange Recipient for travel and subsistence expenses of RSTP Exchange Recipient forces and/or its contractors or subcontractors, claimed for reimbursement or applied as local match credit, shall not exceed rates authorized to be paid exempt non-represented State employees under current State Department of Personnel Administration (DPA) rules. If the rates invoiced are in excess of those authorized DPA rates, then RSTP Exchange Recipient is responsible for the cost difference and any overpayments shall be reimbursed to EDCTC and Caltrans on demand.

13. PROJECT COMPLETION

RSTP Exchange Recipient agrees to provide to EDCTC a report summarizing total project costs and milestones for each project using this RSTP Exchange funding within sixty (60) days of completion.

14. TERMINATION DATE

This Agreement shall remain in effect for a period of five (5) years from the execution date of this Agreement.

SUBJECT: FISCAL YEAR 2019/2020 FINAL OVERALL WORK PROGRAM, BUDGET, AND GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

REQUESTED ACTION

Adopt Resolution 18/19.26 (Attachment A), approving the Fiscal Year (FY) 2019/2020 Final Overall Work Program, Budget, and Goals and Objectives (Attachment B).

BACKGROUND

The Overall Work Program (OWP) and Budget is the work plan for EDCTC and contains a description of the activities to be undertaken by the Commission in the coming fiscal year along with detailed budget information.

DISCUSSION

The Draft OWP was presented at the March 7, 2019 Commission Meeting. The Draft was reviewed by Caltrans and the changes have been included. Caltrans had changes to the text in the OWP document which did not change the budget.

The following changes were made to the Final OWP and Budget:

- Work Element 202 was added for a new Rural Planning Assistance (RPA) grant awarded to EDCTC. This grant is to update the El Dorado County Travel Demand Model to comply with Senate Bill (SB) 743 which changed the measure for determining transportation impact analysis to Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT).
- Work Element 111 was added for the Rural Counties Task Force (RCTF) which consists of the 26 rural counties. Director Deloria was elected Chair of the RCTF for FY 2019/20 and 2020/21.
 EDCTC will collect dues from the RCTF members for the Chair to travel to California Transportation Committee (CTC) meetings to represent the rural counties.

The budget detail was reviewed with Chair Borelli and Vice Chair Frentzen on June 3, 2019.

The total amount of the FY 2019/2020 Final OWP and Budget is \$1,797,933.26 which is an increase of 3% from the draft budget due to the addition of the new Rural Planning Assistance Grant and RCTF.

SUBJECT: DRAFT EL DORADO COUNTY AND CITY OF PLACERVILLE SENATE BILL 743 IMPLEMENTATION PLANS

REQUESTED ACTION

None. This item is for information only.

BACKGROUND

Senate Bill (SB) 743, signed into law in 2013, requires that local, regional, and state agencies move away from vehicle delay and level of service (LOS) as the metric used to evaluate impacts under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA). SB 743 placed the responsibility on the State Office of Planning and Research (OPR) to determine a new metric to be used in the CEQA analysis. OPR has done so through the identification of Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT) as the new metric to be used. This recommendation would require that VMT per-capita, per-employee, and per-service population be considered for analysis of transportation impacts of land use projects. Regulatory changes to the CEQA Guidelines that implement SB 743 were approved on December 28, 2018. July 1, 2020 is the statewide implementation date and agencies may opt-in use of new metrics prior to that date.

To assist the City of Placerville and El Dorado County with implementation of these new requirements, on March 1, 2018 EDCTC entered into a professional services agreement with Fehr & Peers to perform work on the El Dorado County and City of Placerville SB 743 Implementation Plans (the Plans). Since March 1, 2018 EDCTC has facilitated multiple working meetings with the City of Placerville and El Dorado County staff. EDCTC has been working closely with the City of Placerville, El Dorado County, and Fehr & Peers completing the tasks within the scope of work to assist each jurisdiction with the transition to using Vehicle Miles Travelled (VMT) as the transportation impact metric to be used for CEQA review.

DISCUSSION

Fehr & Peers has been working in direct partnership with El Dorado County and the City of Placerville transportation staff and traffic engineers to review the existing General Plan policies, travel demand model metrics, and other technical elements. The project team used this information to develop VMT estimates by Community Region using both the County travel demand model and the SACOG SACSIM model. This information helped establish a baseline VMT, VMT assessment tool, and VMT thresholds memo. Recently, Fehr and Peers has been working on the case studies looking at theoretical projects that could be analyzed for VMT metrics with the use of the tools developed. Ron Milam of Fehr & Peers will be presenting an update of this effort.
