#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Adopt Resolution 19/20.14 approving the Transportation Development Act Fiscal Year (FY) 2020/2021 Apportionment and Allocation for Local Transportation Funds, State Transit Assistance Funds, and State of Good Repair Funds.

#### **BACKGROUND and DISCUSSION**

The Transportation Development Act (TDA) provides three funding sources:

- 1. Local Transportation Fund (LTF) from a quarter cent of the general sales tax collected statewide.
- 2. State Transit Assistance fund (STA) from the statewide sales tax on diesel fuel.
- 3. State of Good Repair (SGR) from a portion of the Transportation Improvement Fee included in Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA), based on sales tax collected in each county, returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's LTF. The State Controller's Office (SCO) allocates the STA tax and the SGR revenue, by formula, to planning agencies and other eligible agencies. Statute requires that 50% of STA and SGR funds be allocated according to population and 50% be allocated according to operator revenues from the prior fiscal year.

The El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) is the Regional Transportation Planning Agency (RTPA) responsible for apportioning and administering these funds for this region. The attached Findings of Apportionment summarizes the estimates for FY 2020/2021.

The LTF allocation purposes, in order of priorities, as identified by law, are as follows:

- 1. Transportation Development Act fund administration (by EDCTC and the County Auditor);
- 2. Planning and programming undertaken by EDCTC (up to 3% of the fund);
- 3. Pedestrian and bicycle projects (optional, up to 2% of the funds remaining, after administration and planning;
- 4. Public transportation operations (including new transit services that have been identified by the Commission as "unmet transit needs" that are "reasonable to meet"; and,
- 5. Other transportation purposes (including additional transit and bicycle facilities, and streets and roads). The Commission may only apportion (and subsequently may only approve claims for) "other transportation purposes" when all other uses of the funds, to the limits described above, have been exhausted.

EDCTC allocates the LTF funds, as determined by population, for the western slope region of El Dorado County and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency allocates the LTF funds, as determined by population, for the eastern slope of El Dorado County. For FY 2020/2021, the County Auditor

estimates EDCTC's share of LTF revenues for apportionment to be \$5,594,251, plus \$400,000 in fund balance available to program.

#### Administration, Planning, Programming

The County Auditor has estimated \$10,000 for administration from the estimated FY 2020/2021 LTF revenue total. This amount is reimbursed to the County Auditor and is not included in EDCTC's Overall Work Program.

The EDCTC FY 2020/2021 Overall Work Program and Budget includes administration, planning, programming and the annual payment to SACOG for a total of \$440,823.32. EDCTC LTF funds are used throughout the work program to support planning and as a required local match for state and federal grant funds. Under the Commission's Memorandum of Understanding with Sacramento Area Council of Government (SACOG), EDCTC is obligated to allocate 2% of TDA funds for SACOG federal transportation planning and programming activities after administration and any non-motorized allocations. The SACOG allocation equals \$110,823.32 for FY 2020/2021.

#### Non-Motorized – Pedestrian and Bicycle Facilities (Article 3)

State law offers EDCTC an option to apportion up to 2% of the LTF (after administration and planning) to the City and County for facilities provided for the exclusive use of pedestrians and bicycles. The Commission primarily uses these non-motorized funds to provide matching funds for federal and state grants, such as Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality and Active Transportation Program (ATP) grants. The 2020/2021 allocation totals \$113,085.02.

#### **Public Transportation – Transit (Article 4)**

The El Dorado County Transit Authority notified the Commission staff that their claim for FY 2020/2021 LTF funds will be \$5,430,342.66 for operating expenses. A 3% contingency of the Article 4 funds up to a maximum of \$500,000.00 is retained in the LTF fund's unreserved fund balance for transit's future needs. The transit contingency balance is currently at the maximum amount of \$500,000.00.

#### **Other Transportation (Article 8)**

No LTF funds remain available for Article 8 – Other Transportation purposes. If LTF funds were available for the fiscal year, the funds would be apportioned to the City of Placerville and the County of El Dorado by population for all purposes necessary and convenient to the development and operation of the public transportation system, including road rehabilitation, maintenance, and repair.

#### **State Transit Assistance Funds (STA)**

The estimated FY 2020/2021 STA funds available for the El Dorado County Transit Authority is \$1,583,839.00.

#### State of Good Repair (SGR)

The estimated FY 2020/2021 SGR funds available for the El Dorado County Transit Authority is \$253,381.00. Funds will be reimbursed to EDCTA after Commission approval of a claim for an approved SGR project.

**WHEREAS**, it is the responsibility of the EDCTC, under the provisions of the TDA, to review the annual transportation claims and to make allocations of monies from the LTF, STA, and SGR funds based on the estimated revenue upon approving said claim; and

**WHEREAS**, the Auditor of said County is instructed to pay monies in the fund to the claimants pursuant to allocation instructions received from the El Dorado County Transportation Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, the County Auditor issued a report of estimated revenues for LTF for Fiscal Year (FY) 2020/2021 and the State Controller's Office issued a report of estimated revenues for STA and SGR Funds.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that the EI Dorado County Transportation Commission shall review the claims as they are received, approve same for the FY 2020/2021 funds estimated to be available in the LTF, STA, and the SGR funds, and make the following allocations:

- 1. To the El Dorado County Auditor-Controller for administrative costs in the amount of \$10,000.00, per Section 99233.1.
- 2. To the El Dorado County Transportation Commission for TDA administration and for planning and programming in the amount of \$440,823.32, per Section 99233.1 and 99233.2.

- 3. To be reserved by the El Dorado County Auditor's Office for future reimbursements to the City and County for pedestrian and bicycle facilities as programmed and claimed in the amount of \$113,085.02, per Sections 99233.3 and 99234.
- 4. Retain contingency in the amount of \$500,000.00 in the Local Transportation Fund for future transit needs. The previous contingency balance was \$500,000.00 and the maximum amount is \$500,000.00.
- 5. To the El Dorado County Transit Authority for Article 4 purposes, the total amount available of \$5,430,342.66, per Sections 99233.8, 99260(a), and 99262.
- 6. <u>State Transit Assistance Funds</u> To the El Dorado County Transit Authority for State Transit Assistance Funds in the estimated amount of \$1,583,839.00 plus interest, for capital improvements, per Section 99314.6. This allocation is to be paid out as FY 2020/2021 revenues are received and available for payment by the County Auditor.
- 7. State of Good Repair Funds To be reserved by the El Dorado County Auditor's Office for future reimbursements to the El Dorado County Transit Authority for State of Good Repair Funds in the estimated amount of \$253,381.00 plus interest. This allocation is to be paid out after a reimbursement claim for an eligible project is approved by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission has requested that approved claims be paid in full, provided the funds are available.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that allocation instructions shall be prepared for each claimant in accordance with the above, and pursuant to the El Dorado County Transportation Commission rules and regulations. The Executive Director, appointed by the Commission, is authorized to sign the allocation instructions and to issue the instructions to the County Auditor to pay the claimants in accordance with the above allocations and conditions.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the claimants are to be notified by the El Dorado County Transportation Commission of action on their claims.

#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Authorize the Executive Director to sign Amendment 2 of the professional services agreement between EDCTC and Trailhead Labs Inc., to continue support, maintenance, content management, and hosting for the interactive online version of the Western El Dorado County Bicycle Travel Opportunities Map for a not-to-exceed amount of \$3,000, beginning immediately and ending June 30, 2021.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On July 29, 2014, EDCTC submitted an Active Transportation Program (ATP) application to the Sacramento Area Council of Government's (SACOG) for consideration for funding as part of the ATP Cycle 1 Regional Metropolitan Planning Organization competitive funding round. On September 18, 2014 the SACOG Board of Directors approved the award of \$50,000 for the Western El Dorado County Bicycle Travel Opportunities Map (Bicycle Travel Map). The project also received a \$5,000 contribution from the Friends of El Dorado Trail as they were the recipient of an El Dorado County Cultural and Community Development Grant to identify recreational areas for bicycling. On June 15, 2015, EDCTC entered into a Professional Services Agreement with Trailhead Labs Inc. to prepare the Bicycle Travel Map which included both a print map and interactive online map hosted at <a href="https://www.eldoradobikemap.org">www.eldoradobikemap.org</a>. The project was completed in May of 2016 and the Professional Services Agreement included two years of support from 2016-2018 for maintenance, content management system, and web hosting for the online interactive Bicycle Travel Map.

#### **DISCUSSION**

Consistent with the Professional Services Agreement entered into on June 15, 2015, the online interactive map was set to expire June 30, 2018. EDCTC staff decided to pursue a contract amendment to retain the services of Trailhead Labs Inc., to continue maintenance, content management and hosting of the interactive online Bicycle Travel Map. This was deemed to be especially important given the fact that EDCTC still has a high quantity of print maps remaining for distribution, and each of those include the link to the online map at <a href="https://www.eldoradobikemap.org">www.eldoradobikemap.org</a>.

Amendment 1 to the Agreement continued the online map through May 2020 and included an option to add an additional year. Amendment 2 will add the additional year of support for the Bicycle Travel Map for \$3,000 through May 2021. EDCTC will work with partner agencies, community members and organizations to discussion options for the provision of online mapping beyond May of 2021.

SUBJECT: HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM PROGRAMMING

#### **REQUESTED ACTION**

Adopt Resolution 19/20.16 to program \$160,457 in Federal Highway Infrastructure Program (HIP) funds to the Western Placerville Interchanges Phase 2.2 Project.

#### **BACKGROUND**

On May 16, 2018, the California Transportation Commission (CTC) awarded \$1,070,000 in Local Partnership Program (LPP) funds to the City of Placerville to support the eastbound on-ramp for the Western Placerville Interchanges Phase 2.2 project. On August 2, 2018 the EDCTC programmed \$200,000 in Federal HIP funds to the project to serve as a portion of the one-to-one match required by LPP guidelines. On May 2, 2019 the EDCTC programmed an additional \$744,946 in Federal HIP funds to the project as construction capital and to provide another portion of the required one-to-one match. Additionally, Caltrans agreed to provide \$1,000,000 in State Highway Operations and Protection Program (SHOPP) funding to complete the required one-to-one match and provide additional construction capital.

On April 19, 2020, the City notified EDCTC staff of cost increases associated with the project and a resulting shortfall in construction funds. EDCTC met with the City of Placerville and El Dorado County staff to discuss potential funding opportunities to cover cost increases. Should the City be unable to secure the necessary additional funding, CTC staff would probably recommend the CTC deprogram the eastbound on-ramp project from the LPP and award the funds to another project.

#### **DISCUSSION**

EDCTC has been working closely with the City of Placerville, El Dorado County, and Caltrans to identify the additional funds needed to deliver the eastbound on-ramp. Based on discussions with SACOG and El Dorado County, EDCTC staff determined that HIP funds are the most readily available funds not already programmed or planned for another purpose. HIP funds, \$650 million appropriated from the General Fund of the Federal Treasury in 2010, are reimbursable federal aid funds, subject to all the requirements of Title 23, United States Code. HIP funds may be used for restoration, repair, construction and other activities eligible under the Surface Transportation Program.

EDCTC's share of these funds for the current fiscal year is estimated at \$160,457. The current year's allocation of HIP funds combined with the \$744,946 in HIP funds previously programmed to construction, along with \$325,054 in local funds, 1,070,000 in LPP funds, and \$1,000,000 in committed SHOPP funding would provide the City with the necessary construction funds to cover the increased costs associated with construction of the project.

On April 19<sup>th</sup>, the City requested the \$160,457 in HIP funds to support delivery of the eastbound on-ramp. El Dorado County and the EDCTC Technical Advisory Committee support programming the available HIP funds to the City of Placerville. Should the EDCTC approve this programming

action, EDCTC staff will meet with the County and City to establish a list of priorities for HIP funds over the coming years or as HIP funds become available. As part of this discussion, EDCTC will work with the County to ensure they receive an equal balance of HIP funds as the City has to date.

## RESOLUTION OF THE EL DORADO COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION APPROVING PROJECT TO BE FUNDED WITH HIGHWAY INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM FUNDS

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to California Government Code, Title 7.95, Section 67950, the El Dorado County Transportation Commission (EDCTC) was created as a local planning agency to provide regional transportation planning for the area of El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and

**WHEREAS**, California Government Code Section 29532.1(g) identifies EDCTC as the designated regional transportation planning agency for El Dorado County, exclusive of the Lake Tahoe Basin; and

**WHEREAS,** it is the responsibility of EDCTC, under the provisions of the Memorandum of Understanding with the Sacramento Area Council of Governments (SACOG), to program and track projects to be funded with Highway Infrastructure Program (HIP) funds; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 19, 2020 the City of Placerville submitted a request to EDCTC to consider the programming of HIP funding to one project; and

WHEREAS, the City of Placerville has requested \$160,457 to deliver the project; and

WHEREAS, as of May 7, 2020 the available HIP fund balance is \$160,457; and

**WHEREAS**, this project submitted for consideration for programming has been determined to be HIP Eligible; and

**WHEREAS**, any HIP funds remaining at the completion of the programmed project will be returned to EDCTC for re-programming to a HIP Eligible project.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the El Dorado County Transportation Commission approves the programming of \$160,457 in HIP funds as follows:
